The [Sustainability Tracking, Assessment & Rating System \(STARS\)](#) is a transparent, self-reporting framework designed specifically for higher education, allowing colleges and universities to measure and benchmark their sustainability performance. Institutions can review publicly available [STARS reports](#) to gain insights, track progress, and identify areas for improvement, fostering a culture of continuous sustainability advancement.
